Narrative nonfiction is fact-based storytelling—real events told with the craft and style of a novel. Sometimes called "creative nonfiction" or "literary journalism," these books use compelling and immersive details to bring true stories to life.


Behind the Beautiful Forevers by Katherine Boo

A memoir about the author's tumultuous childhood, growing up in poverty with irregular and neglectful parents.




Hidden Figures by Margot Lee Shetterly

The story of Henrietta Lacks, whose cancer cells were taken without consent, leading to major medical breakthroughs.




In Cold Blood by Truman Capote

A chilling, nonfiction novel that details the brutal 1959 murder of a Kansas family and the investigation that followed.




Into the Wild by Jon Krakauer

A gripping true story about British intelligence officer Oleg Gordievsky, who spied for the West during the Cold War.




Unbroken by Laura Hillenbrand
