


Brave New World

In a controlled, consumer-driven society, a man challenges the limits of happiness and individuality.




A Canticle for Leibowitz

A young nobleman must navigate politics, religion, and ecological struggles on a desert planet crucial for the universe's power.




Fahrenheit 451

In a future where books are banned, a fireman begins to question his role in enforcing censorship.




Foundation

A scientist predicts the fall of a galactic empire and lays the groundwork for its rebirth over centuries.




The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy

A modern African American writer is mysteriously transported back in time, confronting the brutal realities of slavery.




The Left Hand of Darkness

A stranded astronaut uses his ingenuity to survive on Mars, battling both isolation and extreme conditions.




Nineteen Eighty-Four

In a totalitarian regime, a man begins to question his reality and the government's manipulation of truth.




Ready Player One
