

In 19th-century Arizona, a woman contends with personal loss and strange visions during an ongoing desert drought.




Lonesome Dove by Larry McMurtry

A young woman joins an outlaw gang in the Wild West, seeking freedom and a new future amidst danger.




Riders of the Purple Sage by Zane Grey

A mysterious gunslinger helps a struggling family, but his violent past catches up with him.




The Shootist by Glendon Swarthout
